<p>Child and youth welfare is a central field of social work. The theory and practice of child and youth welfare are examined in detail in the course.</p> <p>In the course, this field of social work presented by using examples of various offers from outpatient and stationary child and youth welfare in Germany.</p> <p>Topics of the course:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• introduction to a contemporary image of man as a basis for work in child and youth welfare</li> <li>• socio-political mission of child and youth welfare in Germany</li> <li>• Legal basis of child and youth welfare in Germany (SGB VIII)</li> <li>• psychosocial and educational support in SGB VIII (various offers from outpatient and stationary helps: „Erziehungsberatung, Erziehungsbeistandschaft, Sozialpädagogische Familienhilfe, Heilpädagogische Tagesstätte, verschiedene Formen der stationären Kinder- und Jugendhilfe“)</li> <li>• Excursion to a children's and youth welfare institution in Regensburg to get to know youth welfare services</li> <li>• application of the individual aids to case studies from child and youth welfare services</li> <li>• results of impact research in child and youth welfare</li> </ul> <p>The theoretical basics are deepened with practice-oriented tasks in small groups.</p> <p>The course takes place as a block course.</p> <p>The course is held alternately in German and English.</p> <p>The language objective is to convey a glossary of central terms of child and youth welfare in English.</p> <p>(As part of the course there will be an excursion to a child and youth welfare institution in Regensburg).</p>
